

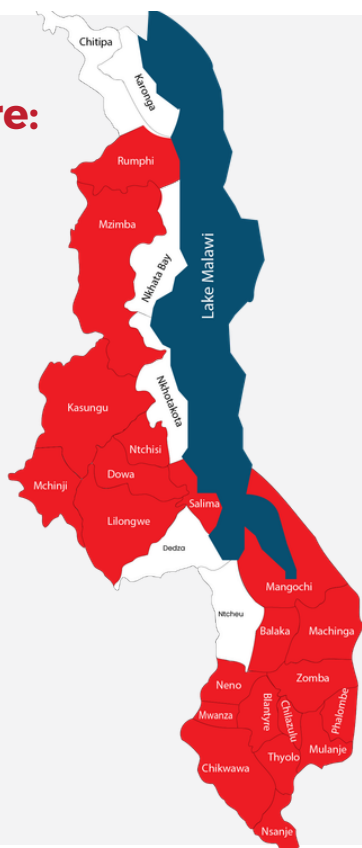

DAPP MALAWI'S HEALTH PROGRAMS

- Total Control of the Epidemic (TCE) model implemented in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and the National AIDS Council
- Empowers and trains community health workers to deliver people-centered services
- Integrates prevention, economic empowerment, and social protection

► HIV/AIDS

DAPP Malawi targets adolescent girls and young women (AGYW), equipping them with life skills, access to healthcare, and economic support to reduce their risk of HIV.

In 2025, DAPP engaged:

- 47,000+ AGYW with the HIV prevention program
- XX people tested for HIV
- 81,000+ people through HIV prevention and SRHR services



► Tuberculosis

DAPP deploys portable, AI-assisted X-ray equipment to accelerate TB screening and diagnosis in high-burden areas.

In 2025, DAPP's programs supported:

- 1,938 TB cases notified by community-based volunteers
- 6,375 community volunteers deployed across 10 districts
- 99.8% TB treatment success rate

► Malaria

DAPP has implemented a wide range of malaria programs.

DAPP deploys Social and Behavior Change Communications (SBCC) to improve knowledge and awareness of malaria prevention and increase early detection.
