

# Total Control of TB

## Our impact across diverse countries



Over the past 15 years, Humana People to People members have implemented TB projects impacting over 18.5 million people. We have built community-based networks of passionate local volunteers who are at the centre of bringing TB services to the people at community-level. We have assisted millions of people living with TB and their families to overcome barriers driving stigma and discrimination. We have given emotional and nutritional support to people taking daily TB medication, and given them funds to meet transport costs related to accessing services. We have worked with health facilities and staff to provide health services. We are proud of the impact we have had across diverse communities, countries and continents. Below is a small sample of our recent work.



### Angola

ADPP Angola is implementing a community HIV and TB project in Angola with a goal of reducing the spread of TB among the most at risk people. The initiative strives to improve methods of TB prevention, referral for treatment and quality care. Directly Observed Therapy is strengthened by establishing functional TRIOs for effective treatment adherence.



ADPP Angola started the first ever community sputum collection and supported the production of the first TB Community Strategic Plan in Angola.

In 2023, the project reached 24,424 people with TB information and identified 4,023 TB cases who were supported through Directly Observed Treatment therapy across 23 municipalities.

### Democratic Republic of Congo

HPP Congo focuses on stopping the spread of TB by finding presumptive cases, collecting and transporting sputum to the lab for testing, bringing results to the people and linking TB positive people with health facilities for treatment and care, follow up on patients on treatment to ensure adherence, follow and reintroduce to treatment defaulters.

Total Control of TB Katanga also addresses stigma and discrimination through raising awareness. 2,452 Community Health Workers and 104 Field Officers have, screened 1,861 403 people between the years 2021 and 2023. A combined 253,069 presumptive TB cases were identified and referred to medical support services. 213,577 were diagnosed and 29,129 people who tested positive for TB, were notified with 99% initiated on treatment.



### Guinea Bissau


ADPP Guinea Bissau has implemented an HIV and TB programme reaching 35,000 people over the past 11 years. At the heart of the TB activities was TB Active Case Finding, referring presumptive TB cases to health facilities for medical attention, supporting TB patients to adhere to their treatment, raising awareness on TB prevention and formation of TRIOs for all people on treatment to reach adherence as well as achieving TB cure.



### India

Humana People to People India is contributing towards the achievement of Government of India and WHO End TB Strategy targets of reducing TB incidence by 90% and deaths by 95% through its TB projects. The projects are increasing treatment coverage of all forms of TB and supporting community systems for resilient and sustainable TB services. 690,840 people in four of India's mega cities were screened between August 2023 to June 2024. Over 20,000 presumptive cases identified and about 17,000 people were tested and 3,457 people with TB were detected out of whom 3,380 were initiated on treatment.





## Laos

HPP Laos's Total Control of TB Bolikhamxay and Oudomxay projects raise awareness on spread of TB and identify people infected with TB through active TB case finding. Treatment supporters are trained to support those infected with TB to adhere to treatment. In 2023, the projects reached out with TB related messages to 34,471 people, this resulted in identifying 2,247 TB presumptive cases of which 193 tested positive for TB and were initiated on treatment.

## Malawi

DAPP Malawi through the USAID funded TB LON II Project is reducing the burden of TB by actively finding TB presumptive cases both at health facility and community, encouraging treatment initiation and adherence for both drug susceptible and resistant TB patients, providing psychosocial counselling and food supplements as part of ensuring successful treatment completion. In 2023, the project reached out to 875,216 people with key TB messages, screened 540,052 people for TB, identified 57,566 presumptive cases and diagnosed 1,879.



## Mozambique



ADPP Mozambique started to implement TB community screening, referral for treatment and care in 2007. For the past five years, ADPP Mozambique engaged 5.7 million people with TB education, and 5.4 million were screened out of whom 98,438 were diagnosed TB positive and received DOT. Currently, ADPP Mozambique is leading the implementation of the Local TB Response project, which covers 50 districts in the provinces of Nampula, Zambezia, Sofala and Tete. Local TB Response is designed to support Government of Mozambique's efforts to achieve TB elimination by 2035. The project's holistic approach includes community screening through contact investigation, active case finding, screening in prisons and at health facilities and support people affected by TB until cured and support child contacts to receive TB preventive medication. In 2023, close to 1.8 million people were screened for TB out of whom 32,822 were diagnosed with TB.

## Zambia



DAPP Zambia is implementing Total Control of Tuberculosis (TC-TB) with the objective of finding the missing children with tuberculosis. The activities focus on increasing uptake of TB preventive treatment, improving diagnosis and uptake of treatment until treatment completion. TC-TB is reducing TB incidences and mortality among children in three high-risk sub-districts of Lusaka. DAPP Zambia engages treatment supporters, TB survivors, community leaders and parents whose children have completed treatment to participate in community dialogue meetings. At the centre of the programme is community engagement and engaging people affected by TB and empowering them with knowledge and skills.



## Zimbabwe

DAPP Zimbabwe's Total Control of TB Makoni promotes access to TB and HIV health services to the people in all communities of the district, however far from the health facilities as part of raising TB prevention, diagnosis, treatment and care. Contacts for current and former TB patients are traced for any chances of infection and those found TB infected are initiated on treatment. The project supplies health facilities with laboratory equipment for rapid and accurate diagnosis of TB. In 2023, over 98,000 people were reached with TB and HIV information, 50 local leaders and 50 community volunteers were trained on TB awareness raising, reduction of stigma and discrimination and 80 new people were diagnosed with TB.



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
