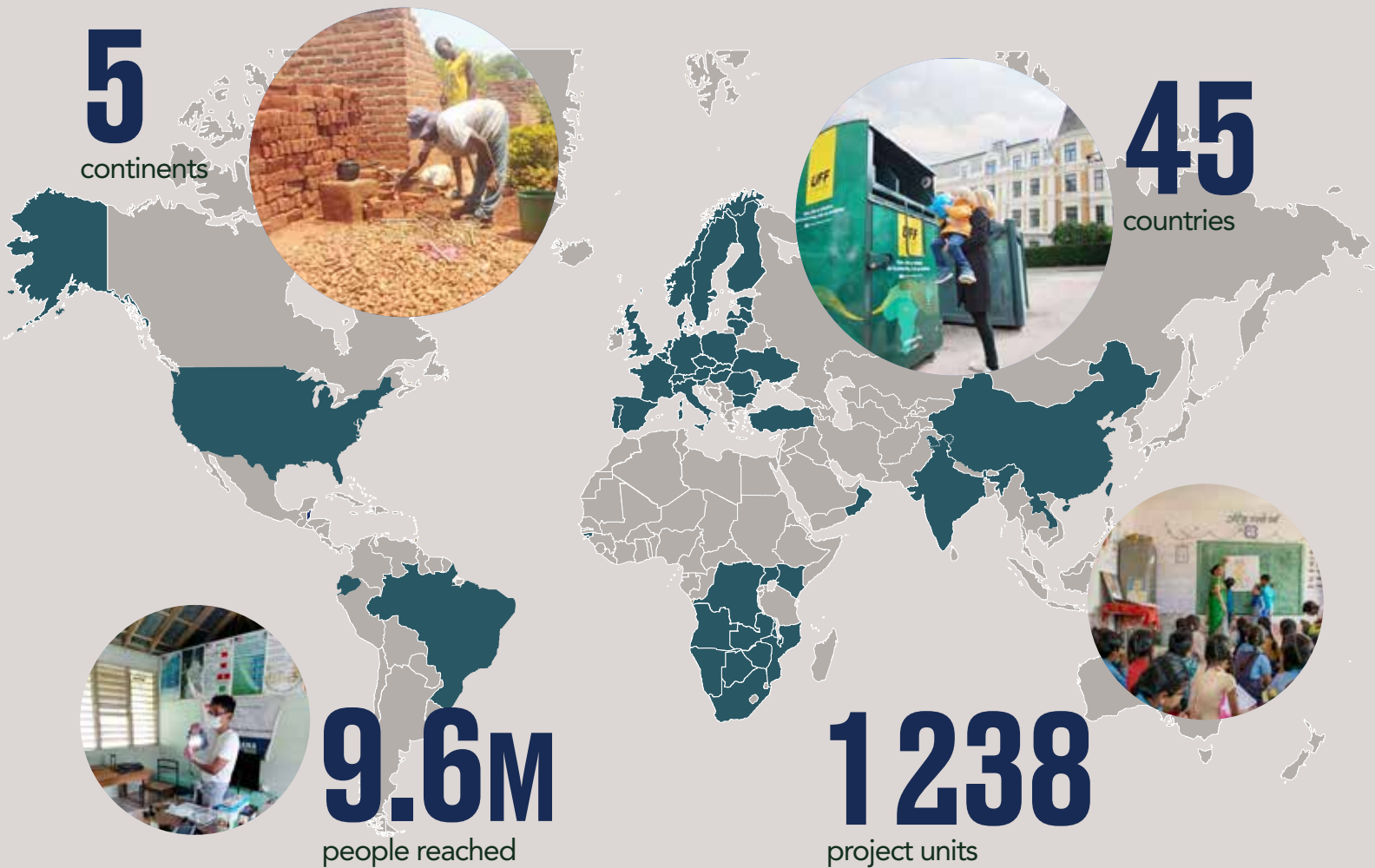


## About Us

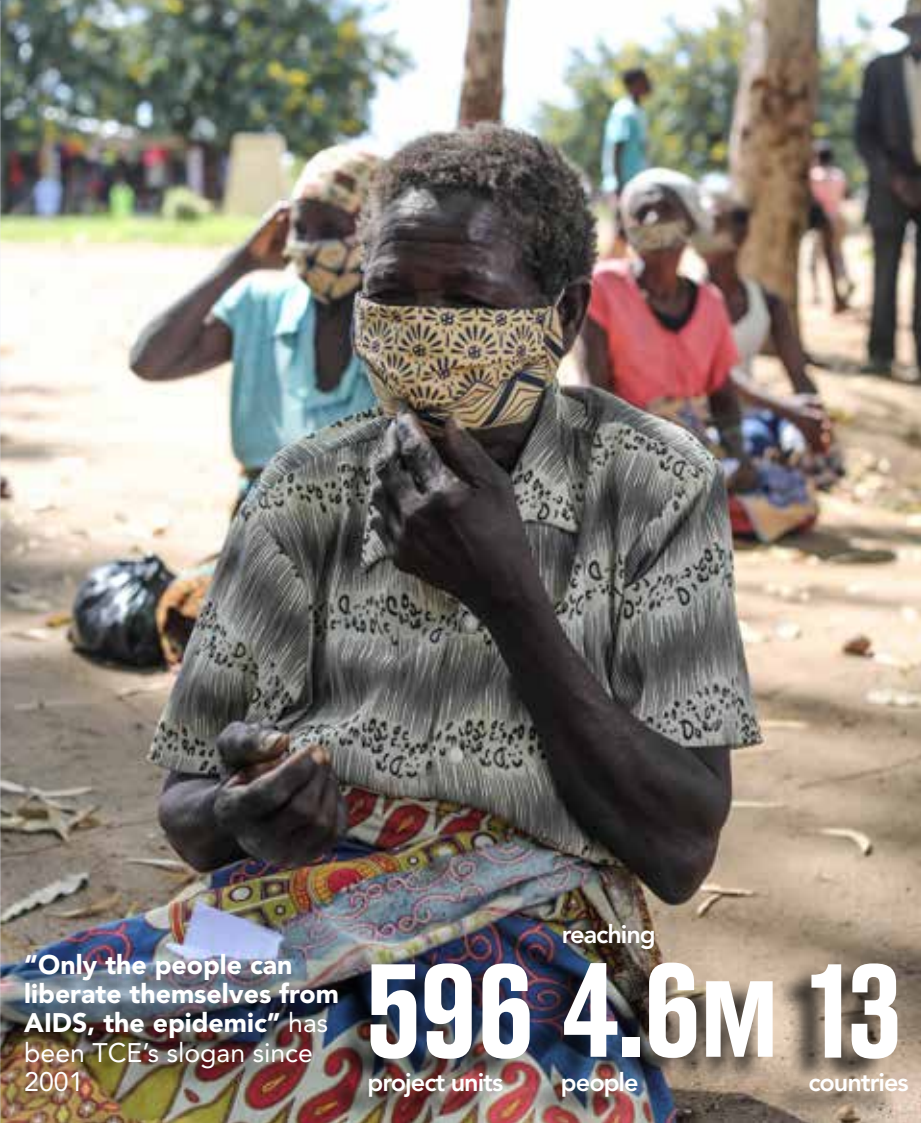
